

More than just a walk in the hills



The Dorenell Visitor Centre is open daily where you can find out about the local history and wildlife, the construction of Dorenell Wind Farm and the work of Dorenell Ranger Service. The centre is unmanned and opening times may vary with the centre also being used for schools and events, please contact the Ranger Service for more information. An all access toilet is open 24/7.

As part of our plans for the wind farm we carried out a study of the wildlife in the local area. This showed there were some protected species present and we continue to undertake monitoring surveys. EDF Renewables has a Zero Harm ambition that includes looking after and enhancing the environments we work in.

There are lots of other interesting animals, birds and plants to see whilst using the trails.

It is essential to reduce deer numbers by shooting to keep numbers in balance with their habitat. Please observe any warning signs and take care to act accordingly.

Follow the Scottish Outdoor Access Code by avoiding any route likely to damage the environment or disturb land management operations and keep your dog under tight control around livestock and during ground nesting bird season (April-June).

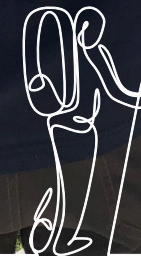

Key

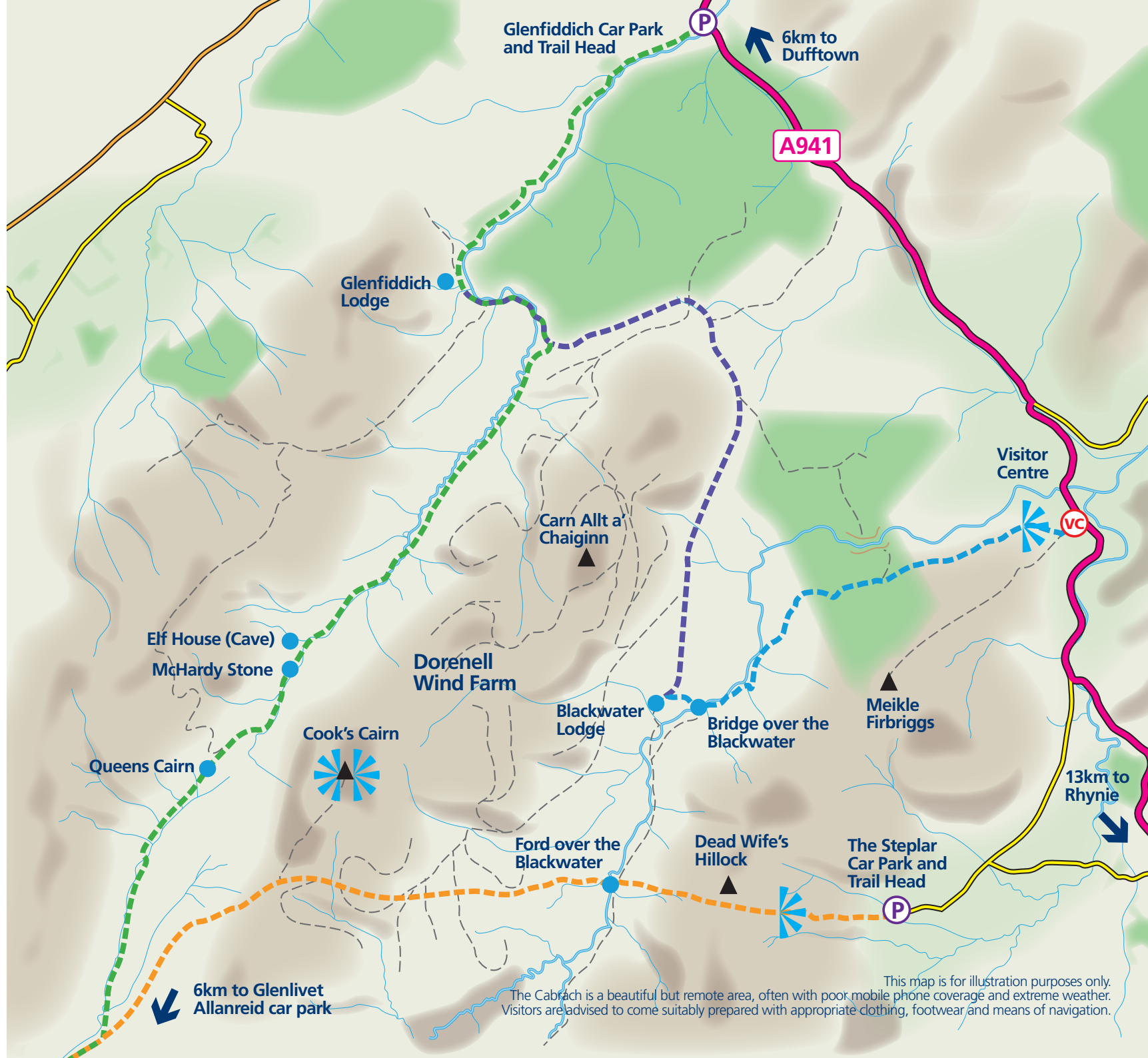
SP29 Glenfiddich to Glenlivet - 20.5km
Well defined tracks with moderate climbs. This route requires you to ford small rivers.

SP30 The Steplar, Cabrach to Glenlivet - 15.2km
This route requires you to ford a river. Please take into account recent weather and time of year when planning this route. Well defined tracks with moderate climbs.

Visitor Centre to Blackwater Lodge - 5.5km
Well defined tracks although these may be boggy in places.

Glenfiddich Lodge to Blackwater Lodge - 7.5km
Well surfaced track with gentle climbs.
